Programme Overview

The Faculty of Dental Sciences, University of Sri Jayewardenepura offers a range of clinical elective student programmes with unique and enriching educational experience for international students. These programmes provide opportunities for students to gain practical knowledge and experience in a variety of specialties and to develop a deeper understanding in the field of dentistry.

Students who participate have the chance to observe and assist experienced dental professionals in a real-life clinical setting while getting exposure to the tropical oral diseases prevalent in South Asia. The faculty provides clinical training through Professorial Dental Unit at Colombo South Teaching Hospital, National Dental Teaching Hospital of Sri Lanka (which is the prime center of the country providing services for managing orofacial malignancies, cleft and craniofacial anomalies and craniomaxillofacial trauma), Teaching Hospital, Kalutara, and Institute of Oral Health, Maharagama. Elective students also can gain exposure to the Sri Lankan culture and way of life and have the opportunity to make new connections and build professional networks that can benefit them throughout their careers.

Eligibility Criteria

Applicants should:

- Be enrolled as a dental student in a recognized overseas university.
- Have completed a minimum of six months of clinical training in their home institution.
- Possess adequate English proficiency for communication and learning.
- Obtain approval from their parent institution to undertake the elective.

Duration

Duration 1 to 8 weeks per academic year (as chosen by the student)

- **Minimum duration in one department - 1-2 weeks**
- **Maximum duration for entire elective - 8 weeks**
- **One student is only allowed 3 elective programmes for a lifetime.**
- You may spend the entire period in one department or rotate between different departments.
- Once your application is accepted and approved, you will receive the Offer Letter signed by the Dean.
- This confirms that a position in the International elective programme is reserved for you.

Commencement

All round the year (Always check with the elective coordinator for availability of the clinical elective programme before you register).

Application Procedure

International dental students who meet the required qualifications and criteria are required to submit the following documents:

1. Filled Application indicating dates & appointments (Website)
 2. Letter from the Dental School/University confirming studentship
 3. Letter from your Dental School/University granting permission to undertake the elective at our university.
 4. Cover letter indicating your preferred duration and disciplines (Please address the cover letter to: Dean, Faculty of Dental Sciences, University of Sri Jayewardenepura, Gangodawila, Nugegoda, Sri Lanka)
 5. Resume or a brief curriculum vitae.
 6. Photograph (Passport Size jpg or png)

- All of the above documents need to be sent via e-mail to dean.fds@sjp.ac.lk, office.fds@sjp.ac.lk & dinithiekanayake@sjp.ac.lk.
 - You may spend the requested period in one discipline throughout the stay or split and stay in number of different disciplines according to your preference.

- **However, you are not allowed to provide clinical care for patients.**
- Applications are reviewed by the Elective Coordinator. Successful applicants will receive an official Offer Letter after checking the availability approximately within 3 weeks. We regret that we cannot give you an exact processing time. As the processing time depends on many factors.
- It is advised to send your application at least 3 months prior to the intended commencement of the attachment.

Fees for the year 2026

- **1–4 weeks: USD 400**
 - **5–8 weeks: USD 550**

- Once you submit your application with the other required documents mentioned above, the Elective Coordinator will check for your eligibility and will email the Offer Letter.
 - **All fees are payable in full in USD. A scanned copy of the elective payment slip need to be emailed to the, dean.fds@sjp.ac.lk , office.fds@sjp.ac.lk and lalani@sjp.ac.lk after confirmation of the elective appointment before the registration.**
 - Fees are generally non-refundable.
 - Where justified circumstances arise, postponement of the appointment by one year may be considered.

Fee Policy Update (Effective from 1st, January 2027)

- The above fee structure will remain valid **until 31st December 2026.**
- From **1st of January 2027**, the fee structure will be revised
- **US\$ 100 per week (maximum duration: 8 weeks = US\$ 800)**
- An additional **non-refundable administrative fee of US\$ 20** will be charged from all students
- **Offer Letter will be issued only after receipt of the non-refundable administrative fee.**
- All revised fees will apply to applicants registering from 2027 onwards.

- **Final payments should be in US dollars (payment from Sri Lankan Rupees will not be allowed)**
- **The bank charges & other taxes should be borne by the applicant. The student name must be clearly mentioned as a reference at payment.**

IMPORTANT:

Students who wish to sit for the ERPDS examination in Sri Lanka in due course will not be enrolled on this elective programme.

Medium of teaching: English

Medium of communication of patients:

Local languages (mostly) or English. Your peer Sri Lankan students will assist you with English translations.

Registration and Commencement of the Elective

Registration on Arrival

Register on day 1 or on any weekday prior to the hospital visit. (from 8am to 4pm)

- For registration, meet Assistant Registrar (AR) at Dean's office of Faculty of Dental Sciences, University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

Prerequisites for registration:

- The Offer Letter issued from the FDS, USJ confirming elective appointment
- Proof of payment* (payment receipts)
- Proof of Identity (eg: Passport)
- Two Passport size Photographs
- Letters from your Faculty/University confirming the studentship and approving the elective attachment

***Important:** You will have to complete the full payment of the elective course that is mentioned in the offer letter prior to commencement. Bank receipts/ screenshots of the online banking receipt of the elective fee has to be submitted to the AR for them to issue you the commencement letter.

You will not be permitted to commence the elective without the payment receipts and the commencement letter.

Upon completion of registration formalities, a commencement letter will be issued.

Meeting the supervisor/s

After registration, visit the relevant unit at Colombo South Teaching Hospital or Faculty of Dental Sciences, University of Sri Jayewardenepura, or other affiliated institution and show the commencement letter to your supervisor/s to start the appointment.

Dress Code and Professional Conduct

- Students are expected to maintain professional standards at all times.
- Dress in smart professional attire

Recommended attire:

- Long trousers, light-coloured short sleeved shirts (or long but folded sleeved shirts) and formal shoes are appropriate to hospital during daytime.
- However please note that clothing such as shorts, tights, short dresses, vests, tank tops, slippers/flip-flops and bright shiny coloured clothes etc. are not considered appropriate inside the hospital or University.
- **Clinical coat/Scrub**
- Dental students are expected to be dressed in clinical coats inside the hospital.
- In the absence of white coats, the scrubs you wear in your own dental schools will be allowed with prior permission taken from the Elective coordinator.
- Please note that clinical coats/scrubs will not be provided by the Faculty/Hospital, and students are expected to bring their own appropriate clinical attire.
- Visible student identification where required

Students must respect patient privacy, confidentiality, institutional regulations, and local cultural values.

Attendance

- Students will receive an attendance sheet from the Dean's Office at the time of registration.
- This attendance record should be maintained by the student and signed by the respective supervisors during the programme.
- In case of any issues or concerns, students are advised to inform the Elective Coordinator.
- Continuous attendance is expected throughout the programme, as it is required for the completion certificate. Absence without prior notice for three consecutive days may be communicated to the respective university.

FEW IMPORTANT NOTES FOR THE ATTENTION OF ELECTIVE STUDENTS

Please note that the month of April is a holiday season in Sri Lanka and most of the activities get slowed down during mid-April. Hospitals will stay functioning, yet the turnover of patients may be lower than usual.

Whenever the final year local students are having their clinical examinations, the wards will be out of bound for all students including elective students.

Please inquire from the Elective Coordinator or Assistant Registrar (AR) for the availability of the elective during the requested duration. (office.fds@sjp.ac.lk)

Certificate of attendance

We are issuing a certificate of attendance to all the elective students with satisfactory attendance. Remember to collect it from Dean's office/Assistant Registrar at the end of your appointment.

PLANNING YOUR VISIT TO SRI LANKA

Visa Requirements

- Details concerning visa can be obtained from <http://www.immigration.gov.lk>. Visa can also be obtained from the Sri Lankan High Commission/embassy in your country. The Department of Immigration & Emigration (DI&E) of Sri Lanka operates a service to issue visa online “Electronic Travel Authorization (ETA)” link: <http://www.eta.gov.lk/slvisa/> .
- We issue letters to facilitate visa only on request. As per our knowledge, taking up study courses including electives are not allowed under tourist visa category.
- However, we are not experts in immigration matters thus we are unable to provide any advice on visa regulations relevant to your country.

Booking a Flight

- Many international airlines operate regular flights to Sri Lanka via Bandaranaike International Airport.
- Sri Lankan Airlines is the national airline of the country and offers a range of international connections.
- The airport, located in Katunayake, is approximately 41 km from Faculty of Dental Sciences, University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

Finding Accommodation

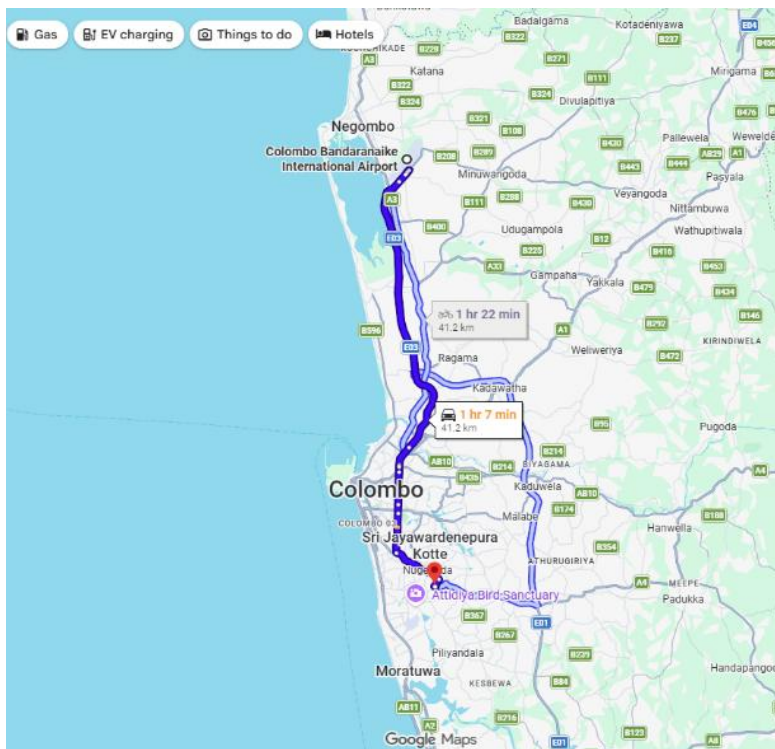
- Please note that hostel accommodation is not provided by the University due to limited availability.
- However, there are several accommodation options available in nearby areas such as Mount Lavinia (approximately 4.5 km from Colombo South Teaching Hospital) and Wellawatte (approximately 3 km away).
- These locations offer a variety of suitable choices, including budget hotels, guest houses, serviced apartments, and private rental properties.
- Participants are encouraged to search for accommodation options through online platforms such as ikman.lk and Tripadvisor, depending on their personal preferences and budget.
- You may also find accommodation through www.booking.com
- Sri Lanka is generally considered safe for visitors; however, as a standard precaution, it is recommended to view and confirm accommodation in person after arrival before making any advance payments.

Currency exchange

- The official currency in Sri Lanka is **Sri Lankan rupees**.
- Money exchange can be done easily at bank counters at arrival lounge, at Colombo International airport Sri Lanka. Also, there are money exchangers in and around shopping malls in Colombo.

- International credit cards are accepted at most hotels, many other shops including supermarkets. It is important to carry personal identification when using credit cards.
- However, some local shops may accept only cash.

Travelling from the airport to hotel

- The journey from Bandaranaike International Airport to the Faculty of Dental Sciences, University of Sri Jayewardenepura takes approximately 1 hour by taxi, depending on traffic conditions. Taxi services are readily available at the airport, and app-based options such as Uber can also be used. Although buses are available, the journey typically requires multiple transfers, making taxis a more convenient and recommended option.



Travel within the city

- Public transportation, including buses, is widely available and affordable; however, journeys may sometimes require multiple connections and may not always be the most convenient option, and therefore are not generally recommended for daily travel.
- For travel within the city, students may use transport services such as Uber and PickMe (apps can be downloaded) tuk-tuks and taxis, which are generally convenient and reasonably priced.
- Navigation within Sri Lanka is convenient using mobile applications such as Google Maps.

Climate

Sri Lanka has a **tropical climate**:

- Temperature: 26°C – 32°C (Colombo area)
- The mean annual temperature varies from 27°C in the coastal lowlands, to 16°C at Nuwara Eliya, in the central highlands.
- Humidity: relatively high throughout the year
- Occasional rainfall depends on monsoon season

- **Recommended clothing:**
- Light, breathable clothing, and comfortable footwear for daily use
- Formal attire for hospital visits
- White coat/scrubs and shoes for clinical observation

About Sri Lanka – Paradise Island



- Sri Lanka is a beautiful island nation in the Indian Ocean, renowned for its scenic coastline, diverse wildlife, rich cultural heritage, and warm hospitality. Often referred to as a “paradise island,” it offers a unique blend of natural beauty and cultural experiences.
- Students may explore nearby historic cities, beaches, hill country landscapes, nature reserves, and a wide variety of local cuisine during their leisure time.
- When planning travel, it is advisable to consider weather conditions and seek local guidance where necessary.
- Students are expected to observe visa regulations, local laws, institutional schedules, and professional responsibilities throughout their stay.

Sightseeing in Colombo

- The beach is located less than 2 km from Colombo South Teaching Hospital and can be easily reached within a short time.
- While it is suitable for walking and relaxation, sea bathing is not recommended in this area due to strong currents and safety concerns.
- Mount Lavinia (4.5km from CSTH) is a famous tourist area with plenty of sea food restaurants on the beach eating places and small, clean and nice hotels.

Places to visit in Colombo

- Independence Memorial Hall (Independence Square)
- Colombo Port City (modern waterfront development)
- Arcade Independence Square (shopping and dining area)
- National Museum of Colombo
- Gangaramaya Temple
- Galle Face Green
- Kelaniya Raja Maha Vihara
- Viharamahadevi Park (largest urban park)
- National Zoological Gardens of Sri Lanka
- Colombo Lotus Tower (modern landmark with city views)

Shopping in Colombo

- Colombo offers a variety of shopping experiences, ranging from modern shopping malls to popular retail areas and local markets.
- The city has several modern shopping malls that provide a combination of retail outlets, dining options, and entertainment facilities. These include well-known city malls and contemporary lifestyle complexes located within Colombo.
- In addition to malls, there are also popular standalone stores, commercial streets, and traditional market areas where a wide range of goods are available at different price levels. These areas provide opportunities for both modern retail shopping and more local shopping experiences.
- For guidance on suitable places to visit, students may seek assistance from local students, who can provide helpful suggestions based on preferences and budget.

Popular Tourist Attractions in Sri Lanka

- Kalutara Bodhiya – A well-known Buddhist temple and sacred site in Kalutara, located approximately 5 km from Teaching Hospital, Kalutara.
- Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic – A cultural and religious site in Kandy (approximately 3 hours from Colombo)
- Pinnawala Elephant Orphanage – Located along the Kandy route (around 2 hours from Colombo)
- Sigiriya Rock Fortress – An iconic UNESCO heritage site (approximately 4 hours from Colombo)
- Kandy Esala Perahera – A vibrant cultural procession held annually in August (in Kandy)
- Galle Fort and nearby beaches – Accessible via the Southern Expressway (about 1–2 hours) or by scenic coastal train
- Mirissa – A popular location for whale watching (approximately 2.5–3 hours from Colombo)
- Kalpitiya – Known for dolphin watching (approximately 3–4 hours from Colombo)
- Ancient cities such as Anuradhapura, Polonnaruwa, and Kandy
- Wildlife safari destinations including Yala National Park, Minneriya National Park, and Udawalawe National Park

Life In Sri Lanka – Useful Information

1. Health Advice

- It is also advisable to drink bottled or properly treated water and to consume well-cooked meals from hygienic and reputable food outlets.
- Students may seek guidance from local colleagues regarding suitable and safe dining options.
- No specific vaccinations or routine drug prophylaxis are required prior to travel unless advised individually by a healthcare provider.
- Visitors are advised to take general precautions against dengue, which may be present in tropical environments. Use of mosquito repellent, especially during daytime hours, is recommended as a simple preventive measure.

2. Driving in Sri Lanka

- Car rental services are available in Colombo. An international driving permit is required for foreign visitors who wish to drive.
- Driving is on the left-hand side of the road. Seat belts are mandatory for front passengers, and helmets must be worn by motorcycle riders.

3. Mobile and Internet Facilities

- The international dialing code for Sri Lanka is +94.
- Mobile networks such as Dialog, Mobitel etc. provide widely available voice and data services, including mobile broadband.
- Wi-Fi is available in most hotels, cafés, and commercial establishments.

4. Diplomatic Services

- Most foreign embassies and consulates are located in Colombo. Contact details and services can be accessed through official embassy websites.

5. Public Holidays

- Sri Lanka observes several public, bank, and religious holidays throughout the year. University and government offices remain closed on these days.

- The months of April and December typically include major festival holidays. It is advisable to check the official holiday calendar in advance when planning activities.

7. Power plugs & Sockets

- In Sri Lanka, power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type D, type M and type G are used.
- The standard voltage is 230 V at a frequency of 50 Hz.
- Students are advised to bring a universal travel adapter, as plug types may differ from those used in their home country.
